• Recent Developments and Chair's Update – Justice

- Eight Research Faculty promotions have been accepted and have gone through, 1 more promotion is pending
 - i. 2 ATP promotions are in progress
 - ii. Campus has been very slow through this process as of late
- Leila De Floriani, UMIACS Joint Appointment renewed
- External Review response has been submitted to the Dean
- Chair's Council
 - i. Two new Af Am hires

- ii. Chairs are encouraged to consider a cluster hire in BSOS
- iii. GEOG should begin looking for potential candidates
- George Hurtt and Sinead Farrell have been invited to lead and serve on the Maryland Forward – Discovery, Creativity and Innovation Subcommittee on campus
- Hannah Kerner GEOG POC for the ESSIC UMD joint workshop on machine learning

• Covid Update – Bell

- COVID procedure on campus
