Recent Developments and Chair's Update - Loboda

- Campus Updates
 - There has been no update on the Out-Of-State Policy since the last meeting
 - The draft remains with the college
 - No update on grace periods or any other specifics
 - As of now, there is no self-imposed limit on OOS hires
 - They told the department as of now, no changes to hiring need to be considered
- Consulting policy
 - The policy on consulting and outside professional activities was updated last year, but needs some reminding and reinforcing
 - o FTE status defines the number of days in a year you are allowed to consult
 - 100% FTE means 52 days
- Fall break
 - UMD is planning on adding a fall break
 - Will not start until after 2024
 - This introduces appointment challenges and course schedule difficulties
 - As much as a week, as few (and more likely) as 2 or 3 days
 - Probably (but not definitive) start in Fall 2025
- New hires:
 - John Jasen is the IT Team Lead.
 - Mengxue Li will work in international recruitment.

- Department Finances and Budgeting Updates
 - Starting Jan 2024, the Department will be covering international student fees
 - Going forward, if your grant negotiates reduced overhead, you will need to budget for administrative support from the Department
 - If you have a "big" grant that is "complex", it will be considered "significant" and will need to include administrative support from the department
- A21 budgets will be reported to PIs starting Jan 2024
 - Fund covers full FY
 - Reports are Jan-Jan

Research Faculty Committee - Ellicott

- Attendees voted on the PTK Merit Policy. Discussions: None. Vote: In favor: 32 Against: 0 Passed Unanimously.
- Results from Research Faculty surveys for: Space Allocation, PTK Titles, and Onboarding. Not clear research professor/scientist titles.
 - Tatiana asks for a proposal from the research faculty.

 Onboarding idea: setting up a Canvas course where all the info is located, with Different sections for fac specialist and research faculty, similar to Graduate Assistant page set by Rachel Haber to house documents.
